# **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council concur with the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add the Metropolitan Council's Travel Behavior Inventory project (SP # 090-070-023).

# Background

This amendment request is to add a project to SFY2018 of the 2018-2021 TIP. The project is the Travel Behavior Inventory (TBI) that was originally included in SFY2017, with paybacks of federal funding in 2019 and 2021. MnDOT has requested that the item be added to the TIP and STIP.

# Rationale

The Transportation Advisory Board approves formal amendments to the TIP and the Metropolitan Council concurs with the action of the TAB. The project is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan (TPP) and meets fiscal constraint because the federal and local funds are sufficient to fully fund the project. The Minnesota Interagency Air Quality and Transportation Planning Committee determined that the project is exempt from air quality conformity analysis. This TIP amendment is using the streamlined process adopted by TAB on April 19, 2014.

This amendment is to add a project to SFY2018 of the 2018-2021 TIP. The funding for the Travel Behavior Inventory (TBI) that was originally included in SFY2017, with paybacks of federal funding in 2019 and 2021. While the funding for the TBI was decided in 2017, the project did not receive authorization and was unable to start in 2017.

The funding for SP 090-070-023 in SFY2018 comes from the project in SFY2017. While the funding for the TBI was decided in 2017, the project did not received authorization and was unable to start in 2017. This is sufficient to fund the project, therefore fiscal constraint is maintained.
