# **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to exercise contract options on Contract 14P084 with Duo-Gard Industries to purchase 22 shelters and 19 pylons for the C Line in an amount not to exceed \$990,000.

# **Background**

The Council awarded Contract 14P084 to Duo-Gard in December 2014. This contract included the initial purchase of shelters and pylons for the A Line, along with options for up to 210 additional shelters and 210 additional pylons for future BRT lines. The current purchase would exercise options for 22 shelters and 19 pylons to be installed on the C Line prior to service launching in 2019. The requested authorization also includes a spare parts allocation for these purchases.

#### Rationale

Council approval is required to exercise options in an amount exceeding \$500,000.

## **Thrive Lens Analysis**

Investment in high-quality transportation options in the Penn Avenue corridor will advance the thrive outcome of prosperity, by making the region more economically competitive through increased workers' access to employment, and support to employers by increasing available workforce with affordable, convenient transportation. The C Line / Penn Avenue project advances the equity outcome by investing in transit in an area of concentrated poverty where more than 50 percent of the residents are people of color.

#### Funding

Funding is authorized and available in project 61404 (C Line) for this purchase.

### **Known Support / Opposition**

C Line corridor communities are supportive of investment in the Penn Avenue corridor. There is no known opposition.
