Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council concur with the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) action to amend the 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to update the project description and add an additional bridge rehabilitation for MnDOT's MN Highway 5 concrete pavement and bridge rehabilitation project.

Background

This TIP amendment is needed to update the project description, add an additional bridge to the project scope, and reflect a decreased project cost. The revised project description and cost are reflected in the draft 2020-2023 TIP but because this project is likely to be let prior to the USDOT's approval of the 2020-2023 TIP/STIP, this amendment needs to be reflected in the 2019-2022 TIP/STIP.

Rationale

The Transportation Advisory Board approves formal amendments to the TIP and the Metropolitan Council concurs with the action of the TAB. The project is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan (TPP) and meets fiscal constraint because the federal and state funds are sufficient to fully fund the project. The Minnesota Interagency Air Quality and Transportation Planning Committee determined that the project is exempt from air quality conformity analysis.

This action promotes stewardship by repairing an addition bridge while reducing the overall project cost.

The project is fully funded with state and federal funds.


