## **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to execute a purchase agreement, with Hoglund Bus Sales (MnDOT Contract 121183) for up to 5 replacement buses in an amount not to exceed \$770,000.

### **Background**

This procurement of 5 buses aligns with the bus replacement schedule and Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). All buses are scheduled to be delivered in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2020. These vehicles will operate in MVTA fixed route service.

### **Rationale**

The purchase of these buses allows for a reliable fleet and quality transit service. The buses that are scheduled for replacement have exceeded the Council's replacement cycle of seven-years and 200,000 miles or have been totaled and must be replaced.

This procurement will use the State of Minnesota's small bus procurement contract which is a 5-year contract that has annual terms from 2017 through 2021. The State did not establish any DBE goals for this contract. This purchase will use federal funds. As a result, MCUB goals are not applicable.

### **Thrive Lens Analysis**

This purchase supports safe and reliable transit infrastructure for all (equity) and enhances the quality of life in the region by providing transportation options.

#### **Funding**

Funding for these vehicles will come from 5307 federal formula funds, Regional Transit Capital and Insurance Proceeds. This project was approved as part the 2019 Budget Amendment – 2nd Quarter, Business Item 2019-187 JT.
