

Where Metro Transit Bus Riders Board






Shelters are where bus riders access the system the most.


Key accomplishments 2014-2020

- Equity focus neighborhoods
- √ 150 new shelters
- √ 75 existing shelters improved with light or heat
- Update Metro Transit's shelter placement guidelines
- ✓ Shelters, light and heat are available at similar or higher rates in the equity focus area compared to the rest of Metro Transit's service area.

2025 Goals

- People of color continue to have equitable access to transit shelters, lighting and heaters
- All bus stops with shelters have accessible boarding areas, pedestrian access, and clear spaces
- Increasing availability of accessible transit stops
- Construction projects result in accessible bus stops



2020-2021 Capital Investments

- 2020
 - Added 15 shelters, replaced 22 aged shelters, and added 25 boarding pads
 - Achieved goal to add 150 new shelters within equity focus neighborhoods
- 2021
 - Focus on replacing aged shelters: 48 shelters
 - Added 11 shelters and 22 boarding pads

 Look at pedestrian accessibility as replace shelters

 MCUB contractors were prime contractors on 2 of 3 improvement contracts

- Adopt-A-Stop






