Regional solicitation

- On 12/16, TAB approved \$214M of federal transportation funds for allocation to projects in 2024/2025
 - Includes about 10% overprogramming for projects that return funds or new federal dollars that come to the region
- **Today's Action**
- Requesting Council concurrence on the project list







Regional Solicitation

- Funded 56 total projects
- Set aside
 - \$25M for the future F-Line ABRT
 - \$4.9 million for unique projects







Strong linkage to regional policy



Qualifying criteria also ask applicants to document consistency with regional policy



*Unique projects are projects that do not fit in the scoring measures for other application categories. TAB will accept applications in the 2022 Solicitation for Unique projects to be funded with federal funds in 2024 and 2025.



Scoring process

- throughout the metro area
- Scoring of projects is an open, transparent, and data-driven process
- **Programming Committee**



Scoring committees made up of 69 scorers and chairs representing agencies

Applicants had an opportunity to appeal their scores in front of the Funding &

Statistics

- 56 projects funded out of 137 submitted (41%)
- \$214M funded out of \$438M requested (49%)
- \$214M of federal funds will leverage \$235M in local funds, totaling \$449M of projects
- **Unmet Need**
- The \$438M requested overall would have leveraged \$351M in local funds, totaling \$789M






Fifty-six projects

Roadway highlights


- 2 traffic management
- 7 strategic capacity
- 4 reconstruction/modernization
- 4 spot mobility/safety
- 2 bridge projects


- 56% of the total funding
- Most road and bridge projects included significant multimodal project elements



Franklin Avenue reconstruction, Minneapolis

- \$7M award (\$13.8M total project)
- Reconstruction also includes pedestrian, bicycle, and streetscaping improvements
- Equity project
















Kellogg/3rd St. Bridge, St. Paul

- \$7M award (\$57M total project, also received state bonding in 2020)
- Replace nearly 40-year-old bridge





Transit and TDM highlights

- 8 transit
- 4 travel demand management (TDM)
- 27% of the total federal funding


Ongoing funding for the transportation management organizations (TMOs)





Burnsville Bus Garage, MVTA


- \$2.8M award (\$3.5M project); also received competitive FTA funding
- Storage for 30 additional vehicles serving the MVTA service area and downtown Minneapolis/St. Paul





F-Line arterial bus rapid transit

- \$25M award
- New ABRT bus route



Bicycle and pedestrian highlights


- Largest federal funding allotment to bike/pedestrian projects in Regional Solicitation history
- 11 multiuse trail and on-street bike lane facilities
- 8 pedestrian projects
- 6 Safe Routes to School projects
- 17% of the total funding





Chaska pedestrian improvements

- \$1M award (\$1.8M project)
- Streetscape, bike racks, lighting, seating, decorative paving





Bike pedestrian bridge, Coon Rapids

- \$2.4M award
 (\$4.8M project)
- Coon Creek
 Regional Trail over
 Coon Rapids Blvd







Highway Safety Improvement Program

- Allocated \$31.6M to 26 safety projects
- 8 roundabouts
- Pedestrian safety
- Lighting
- Greater emphasis this cycle on pedestrian and bicycle safety

- Same action requested for the HSIP projects
