Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council approve an amendment to the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to extend the length, increase the cost, and change the scope of MnDOT's reconstruction project on US Highway 10 in Elk River.

Background

This amendment is requested to update the termini (expanded from 0.82 miles to 1.28 miles), adjust the scope, and increase the total project cost. The project is funded through the National through National Highway Performance Program (NHPP), which is not programmed by TAB.

This project is in the extended urbanized area, small parts of Wright and Sherburne counties that are included in MPO planning and programming. Specifically, this project is in Elk River, Sherburne County.

Rationale

The Metropolitan Council approves formal amendments to the TIP. The project is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan (TPP) and meets fiscal constraint because the federal funds are sufficient to fully fund the project. The Minnesota Interagency Air Quality and Transportation Planning Committee determined that the project is exempt from air quality conformity analysis.

In the spring of 2012, the U.S. Bureau released the updated 2010 urbanized area boundaries for metropolitan areas across the country. This data included portions of Wright and Sherburne counties in Minnesota and Houlton in St. Croix County, Wisconsin, in the Minneapolis-St. Paul urbanized area. Federally funded projects from these areas must therefore be included in the TIP.

The project is fully funded with federal, state, and local funds.

This formal amendment is needed to update the termini (expanded to 1.28 miles from 0.82 miles), add associated projects and correct the total project cost (increased by \$2,603,776).
