2018 - 50 - 50 difference in condition of art lorks a LR1 platforms


2019 - Condition problems on the Replatfolius seems the exception and customers have a clear serve ieco will be repaired if broken




#### **Granite Sculptures**

Sealing and treatment of cracks in sculptures at three Stations: Raymond, Westgate and Union Depot.








<u>Lake Street Midtown Station Mural</u>


