

Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Overview

- Four-year list of transportation projects funded in whole or part with federal funding
- Must include all projects funded with federal transportation funds and projects that affect air quality prioritized by year
- Required for all Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs)
- Incorporated into MnDOT's Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)

Projects In the TIP

- Transit projects programmed by Metro Transit/Council with FTA formula funds
- Roadway projects programmed by MnDOT with federal funds and state funds
- Regional Solicitation projects programmed by the Council
 - Bike/Ped
 - Roadway
 - Transit
 - Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)
- Small number of projects in Sherburne County / Wright County and Houlton, Wisconsin.

Council approval is for all project types in the TIP

Key Criteria for TIP and Amendment Approvals

- Fiscally balanced (consistent with expected funding levels)
- Consistent with Regional Transportation Plan (TPP)
- In conformity with Clean Air Act requirements
- Opportunity for public input


Schedule for 2023-2026 TIP

- TAB release draft for public review May 18, 2022
- Public review/comment period ends July 5, 2022
- TAB considers comments, recommends approval August 17, 2022
- Transportation Committee September 12, 2022
- Metropolitan Council approval September 28, 2022
- MnDOT inclusion into State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) September/October 2022
- Federal approvals November/December 2022

Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council:

- 1. Adopt the 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area.
- 2. Certify that the Twin Cities Metropolitan Planning Process is addressing major issues facing the metropolitan planning area and is being carried on in conformance with all applicable federal requirements of:
 - a. 23 U.S.C. 134 and 49 U.S.C. 5303, and this subpart;
 - b. Sections 174 and 176 (c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506 (c) and (d)) and 40 CFR part 93;
 - c. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 USC 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;
 - d. 49 USC 5332, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, or age in employment or business opportunity;
 - e. Section 1101(b) of Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act (Pub L. 114-357) and 49 CFR Part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in US DOT funded projects;
 - f. 23 CFR part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on Federal and Federal-aid highway construction contracts:
 - g. The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) and 49 CFR Parts 27, 37, and 38;
 - h. The Older Americans Act, as amended (42 U.S.C 6101), prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving Federal financial assistance;
 - i. Section 324 of title 23, U.S.C regarding the prohibition of discrimination based on gender; and;
 - j. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and 49 CFR 27 regarding discrimination against individuals with disabilities.
- 3. Certify the TIP conforms to the provisions of 49 CFR part 20 regarding lobbying restrictions on influencing certain federal activities.
- 4. Find that the TIP is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan, which is in conformance with applicable federal transportation and air quality regulations.
- 5. Find that the TIP meets all applicable federal requirements.
- 6. Find that the TAB provided adequate opportunity for involvement from the public, agency and transit operators through its regular process and public comment period.
- 7. Transmit the 2023-2026 TIP along with these comments to the Minnesota and Wisconsin Departments of Transportation and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.
