What is Network Now?


Setting the course for the next five years

Metro Transit ridership demand is growing


Metro Transit system ridership weekly Total Boardings across service types






Metro Transit service has been reduced

Current Metro Transit System


159 Routes 22.9 million route miles

- 31 Core Local (5 suspended)
- 73 Commuter & Express (49 suspended)
- 47 Suburban & Supporting Local Routes (11 suspended)
- 5 BRT
- 2 LRT
- 1 Commuter Rail

- 5. Plans for service changes through 2027
 - dependent on constraints and scenarios

What is included

- Changes to existing route service
- Frequency or span of existing and planned METRO lines
- Discontinued service and facility closures
- New or redesigned routes
- Speed and Reliability actions


What is not included

- Changes to the construction or alignment of planned METRO lines
- New capital projects
- Fare policy changes
- Projects outside Metro Transit service area
- Long-term or regional planning
- Transportation Policy Plan revisions
