2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program

## **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council:

- 1. Adopt the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area.
- 2. Certify that the Twin Cities Metropolitan Planning Process is addressing major issues facing the metropolitan planning area and is being carried on in conformance with all applicable federal requirements of:
  - a. 23 U.S.C. 134 and 49 U.S.C. 5303, and this subpart;
  - b. Sections 174 and 176 (c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506 (c) and (d)) and 40 CFR part 93;
  - Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 USC 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;
  - d. 49 USC 5332, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, or age in employment or business opportunity;
  - e. Section 1101(b) of Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act (Pub L. 114-357) and 49 CFR Part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in US DOT funded projects;
  - f. 23 CFR part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on Federal and Federal-aid highway construction contracts;
  - g. The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) and 49 CFR Parts 27, 37, and 38;
  - h. The Older Americans Act, as amended (42 U.S.C 6101), prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving Federal financial assistance;
  - Section 324 of title 23, U.S.C regarding the prohibition of discrimination based on gender; and;
  - j. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and 49 CFR 27 regarding discrimination against individuals with disabilities.
- 3. Certify the TIP conforms to the provisions of 49 CFR part 20 regarding lobbying restrictions on influencing certain federal activities.

- 4. Find that the TIP is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan, which is in conformance with applicable federal transportation and air quality regulations.
- 5. Find that the TIP meets all applicable federal requirements.
- 6. Find that the TAB provided adequate opportunity for involvement from the public, agency and transit operators through its regular process and public comment period.
- 7. Transmit the 2025-2028 TIP along with public comments to the Minnesota Department of Transportation.

# **Background**

The TIP is a four-year program of transportation projects funded in whole or part with federal funding. The 2025-2028 TIP is a multi-modal program of highway, transit, bicycle, and pedestrian projects in the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area. The TIP includes \$6.2 Billion in projects and contains projects using federal formula funds selected by MnDOT and the Council, and projects selected through the Regional Solicitations using:

- Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STPBG)
- Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ)
- Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)
- Carbon Reduction Program (CRP)
- Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-saving Transportation (PROTECT)

The region revises its TIP every year. The inclusion of a specific project in the TIP does not imply an endorsement of the specific design alternative or engineering details. Inclusion in the TIP is a funding commitment assuming the individual project development process has or shall have addressed all applicable local, state, and federal requirements. The TAB recommended the 2025-2028 TIP for adoption at its August 21, 2024, meeting. The 2025-2028 TIP is attached.

Also attached is the public comment report, which includes all 98 comments made during the 45-day public comment period. Seventy-one comments were related to bridge repair and replacement projects within the Rethinking I-94 study area, with most (68) expressing opposition. Other comments related to projects at MN 280 and MN 252 along with non-project-specific comments, mostly related to modal preferences.

#### Rationale

The TAB recommends the TIP for Metropolitan Council approval. The TIP is consistent with the Transportation Policy Plan adopted by the Metropolitan Council on November 18, 2020, with FHWA/FTA conformity determination established on December 4, 2020. Public input was provided during a 45-day public comment period.

#### **Thrive Lens Analysis**

This action promotes all five outcomes, as it enables the completion of many transportation projects that help further each.

## **Funding**

The federal, state, and local funds are sufficient to fully fund the projects included in the 2025-2028 TIP.

## **Small Business Inclusion**

Most project included in the TIP are federally funded. The Minnesota Department of Transportation's State Aid office will oversee the federal requirements, including the DBE requirement.
