

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
## Proposed action 2024-193

- Authorize release of the METRO G Line Recommended Corridor Plan for public review and comment
- Direct staff to collect public comments through Friday, October 25, summarize comments, and report the findings to the Metropolitan Council




### **METRO G Line**

- The METRO G Line will be an important link in the growing METRO network
- Fast, frequent, all-day service in an 11.5-mile corridor from Little Canada to West St. Paul
- The G Line will upgrade Routes 62 and 68 to become the main transit service in the Rice Street/Robert Street corridor




# **G** Line project phasing

- G Line construction will be coordinated with planned street projects, including MnDOT's Robert Street South reconstruction project in 2027-2028
- Plan to construct and open the G Line project in two phases
  - Phase 1 will include the north half of the corridor, including downtown St. Paul
  - Phase 2 will extend from downtown St. Paul to the Dakota County Northern Service Center
- The G Line Recommended Corridor Plan identifies station locations for both phases





- Information about how proposed locations were determined
- Other planning considerations
  - Project coordination with agency partners
  - Bus priority treatments
  - Supporting local bus service





# Draft Corridor Plan engagement strategies

- Engagement along the corridor
  - Door knocked over 170 station neighbors
  - Over 400 interactions at 15 community events
  - 87 signs posted at Route 62 and Route 68 bus stops
  - 32,804 postcards sent to residents, businesses, and property owners
- Virtual engagement and communications
  - 919 G Line project subscribers received updates
  - 58,969 Go To card users received email communications
  - 1 virtual open house

## Strong support for the G Line

- 320 survey responses
- 78% of respondents like the G Line project
- 71% of respondents will use the G Line when it opens






#### I will use the G Line when it opens





### **Draft Corridor Plan feedback**

- Majority of survey respondents:
  - Use Metro Transit at least a few times a week or every day (60 percent)
  - Have home ZIP code within corridor (65 percent)
  - Identify as white alone (66 percent)
  - Have lower than average household incomes (77 percent under \$100k)
- 36 percent identify as having a disability






# **Engagement themes**

- Feedback about all station and platform locations along the G Line corridor
- High interest in several specific station and platform locations
- Requests to change or extend the planned G Line alignment
- Interest in pedestrian and traffic safety in the corridor

# Revisions from Draft Corridor Plan


- Stations with additional analysis but no recommended changes:

  - Rice & Cook (within Rice Street Visioning project)
  - Rice & Fuller (within Rice Street Capitol Area Redesign project)
  - Robert & Isabel (within Robert Street South project)
  - Robert & Sidney (within Robert Street South project)
  - Robert & Annapolis (within Robert Street South project)






#### **Cesar Chavez & State**

- During engagement, heard business owner feedback about southbound platform
  - Cited public safety and the loss of 3-4 parking spaces
- Evaluated alternative southbound platform locations with City of St. Paul
  - Pedestrian crossing
  - Design feasibility
  - Potential replacement of parking spaces
- Staff recommends retaining nearside platform location




#### **Robert & Butler**

- During engagement, heard business owner feedback about northbound platform
  - Cited platform maintenance and reducing traffic crashes
- Evaluated alternative northbound platform locations with agency partners
  - Pedestrian crossing
  - Design feasibility
  - Design options to limit impact to business
- Staff recommends retaining farside platform location




# **Robert & Sidney**

- The proposed station location in Draft Corridor Plan was at Robert & Curtice
- The Recommended Corridor Plan proposes station at Robert & Sidney
- This station is within MnDOT's Robert St South reconstruction project
- MnDOT is exploring changes to Robert St:
  - Removal of the traffic signal on Curtice St
  - Improved pedestrian crossing at Sidney St
  - Closure of the driveway in SW corner of intersection
