Basis for Budget Development

Minnesota Statute 473.125

"The regional administrator shall recommend to the council for adoption measures deemed necessary for efficient administration of the council, keep the council fully apprised of the financial condition of the council, and prepare and submit an annual budget to the council for approval."

Annual Budget Development

- The Met Council is committed to being a good steward of public resources as we carry out our mission.
- Each year we develop operating and capital budgets:
 - Operating Budget: Shows expenditures to support the Council's operations, such as employee payroll, rent, debt service, and funds that the Council "passes through" to others in the form of grants and loans.
 - Capital Budget: Shows expenditures that involve major capital assets, such as building light-rail transitways or improvements to facilities.
- Both budgets indicate the funding sources to pay for the expenses and together make up the Met Council's and Metro Transit's budgets
- Basis for Budget Development: MN Statute 473.125

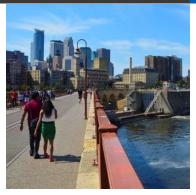
2025-2030 Capital Program

Planning

- Capital projects require longer range view – Long Term Focus
- Bus Procurements 12-24 months
- Major construction projects multi-year (garages, Transitways)
- Funding must be secured and Council-authorized
- Funding multiple revenue sources
- Regional asset preservation plans

System Size

- Over 1,000 regular route and contract buses
- Metro Mobility fleet of 639 small buses
- Over 1,100 customer shelters
- Over 16 support facilities (garages, overhaul base, Police, administration)
- 41 rail platforms
- 65 parking structures/surface lots

2025-2030 Capital Program: System Parameters and Size



System 2025-2030 CIP Parameters and Size:

- Fiscally Balanced Capital Budget
- Includes Regional Sales Tax
- \$6.49B: \$5.24B CIP and \$1.25B ACP (Authorize Capital Program) including LRT Transitways development (Green and Blue Line Ext.)
- \$3.16B: \$2.155B CIP and \$1.0B ACP excluding LRT Transitways development
- Focus is safety, asset prevention and long-term capital maintenance
- System includes Metro Transit, Metropolitan Transportation Services and Suburban Transit Providers
- Reviewing Travel Behavior changes and workforce demand impacts with bus purchase assumptions, deliveries and operators

Revenue Sources

- Regional Transit Capital increasing 3.3% per year
- State bonds assume amounts appropriated and anticipated
- Includes Regional Sales Tax

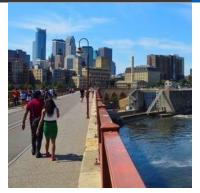

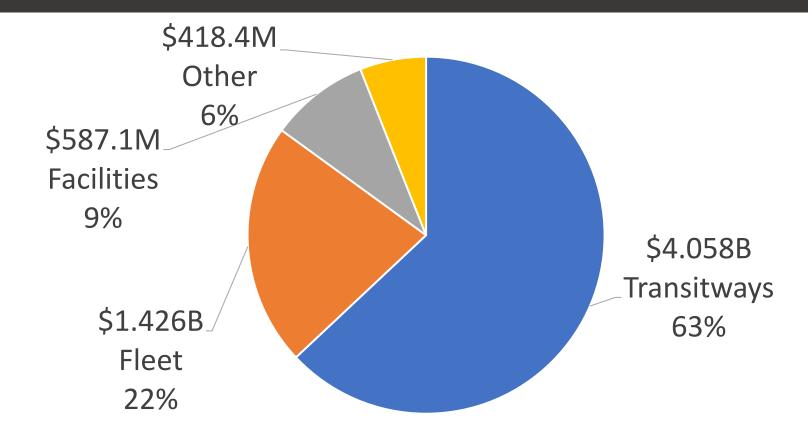

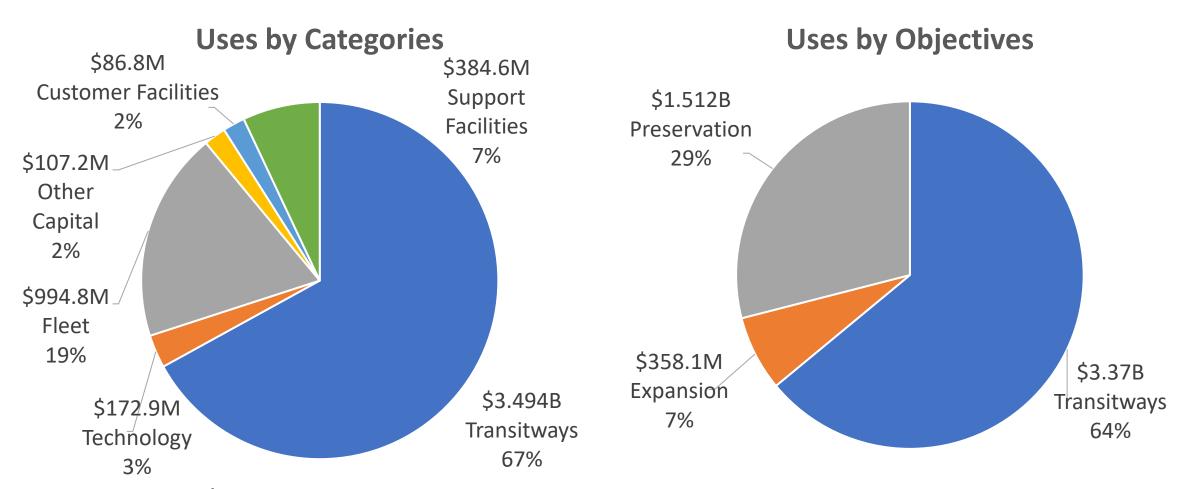


2025-2030 Transit Capital Program \$6.490B



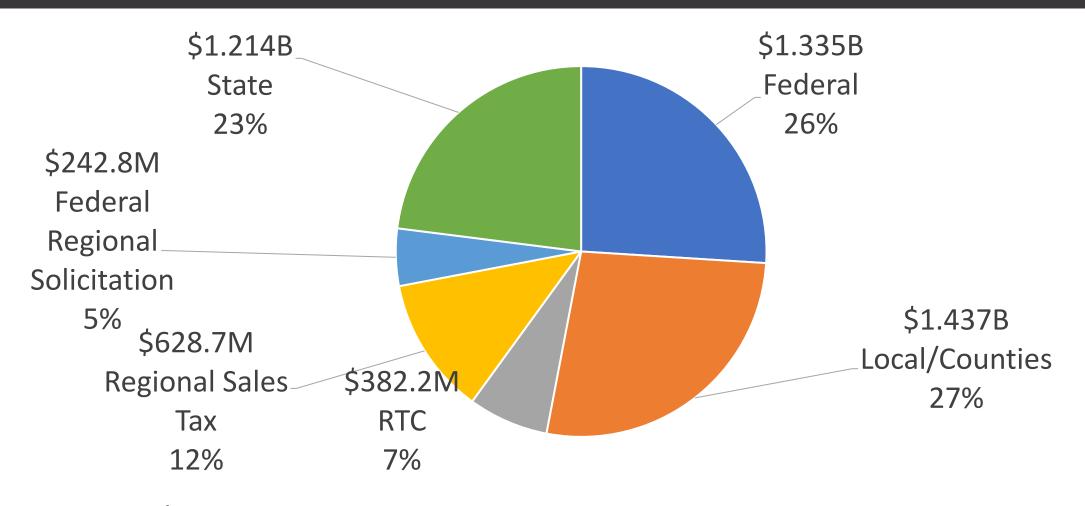
2025-2030 Capital Program future spending includes \$1.25B Authorized and \$5.24B Planned

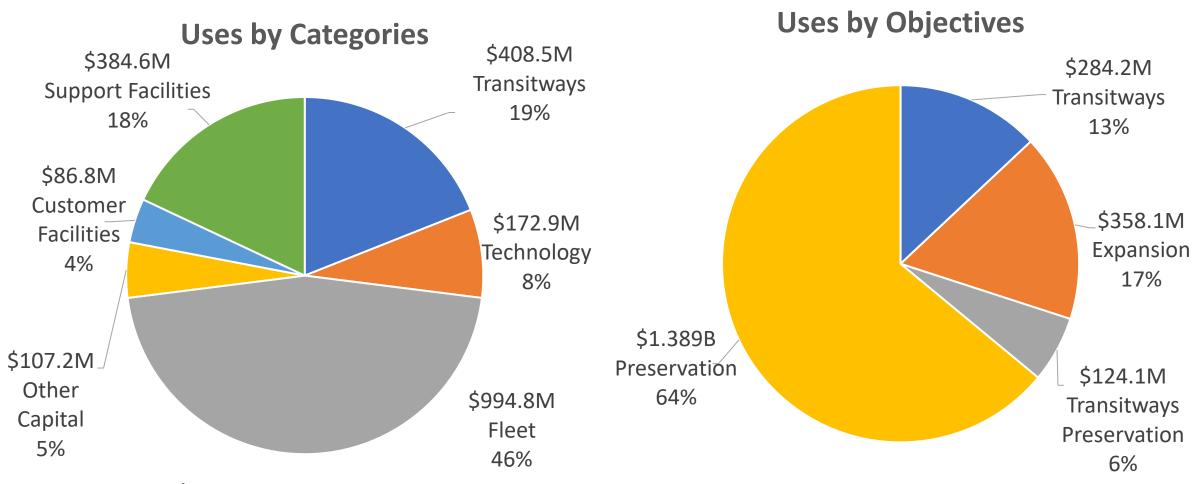

2025-2030 Capital Program Revenue Sources Planned



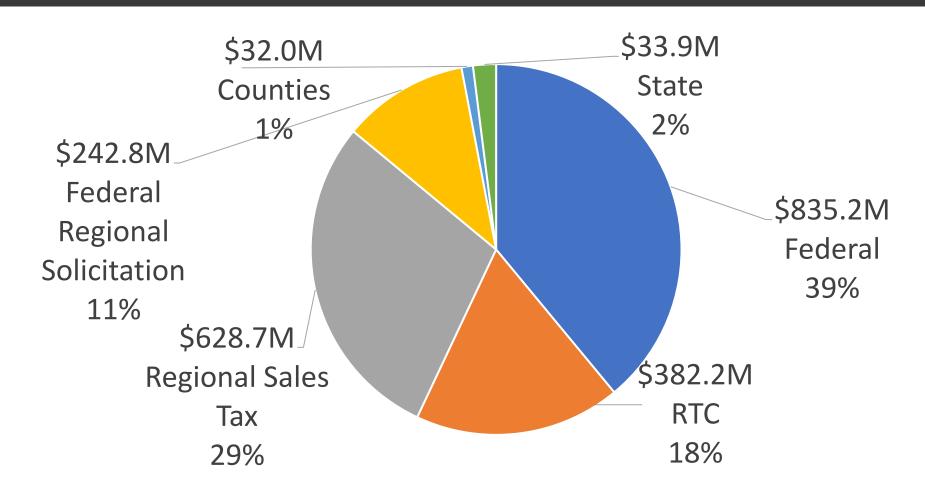

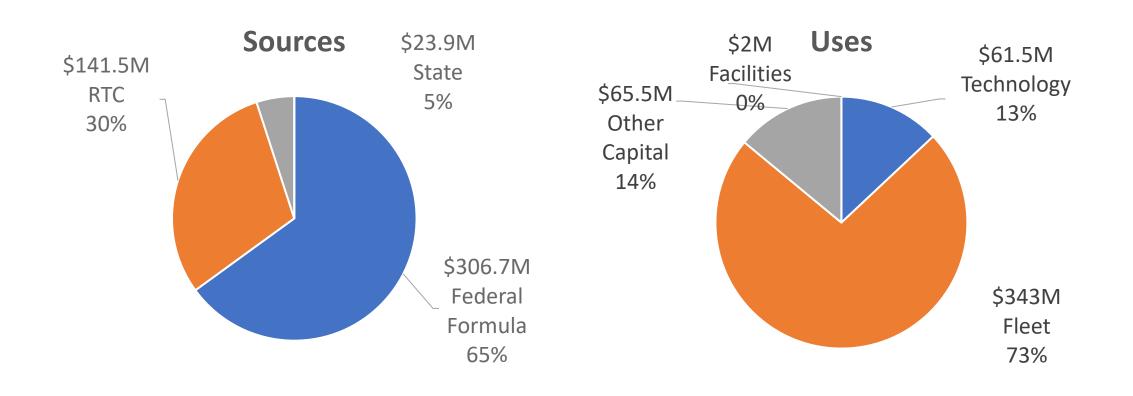

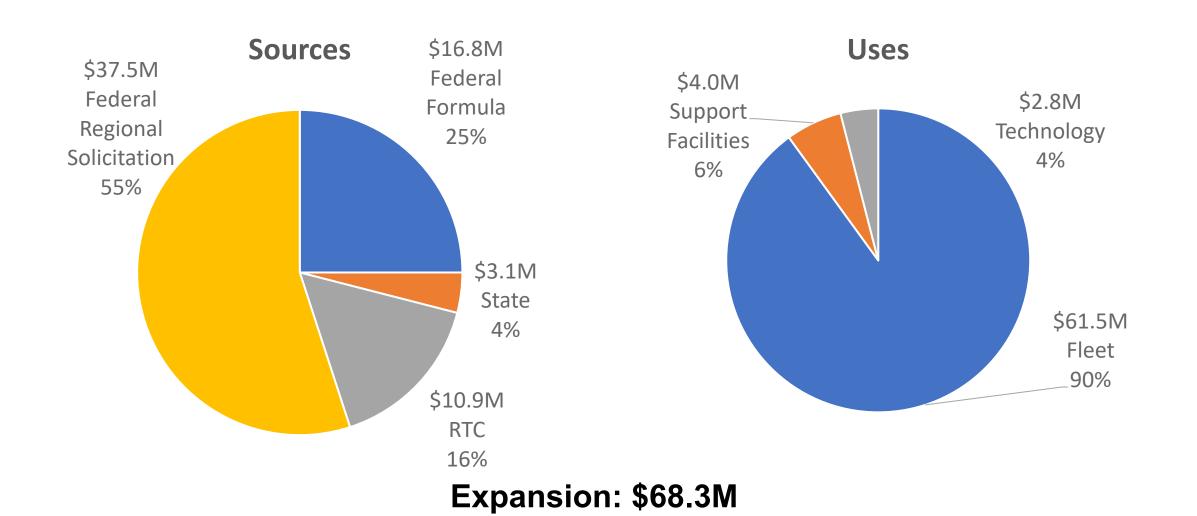

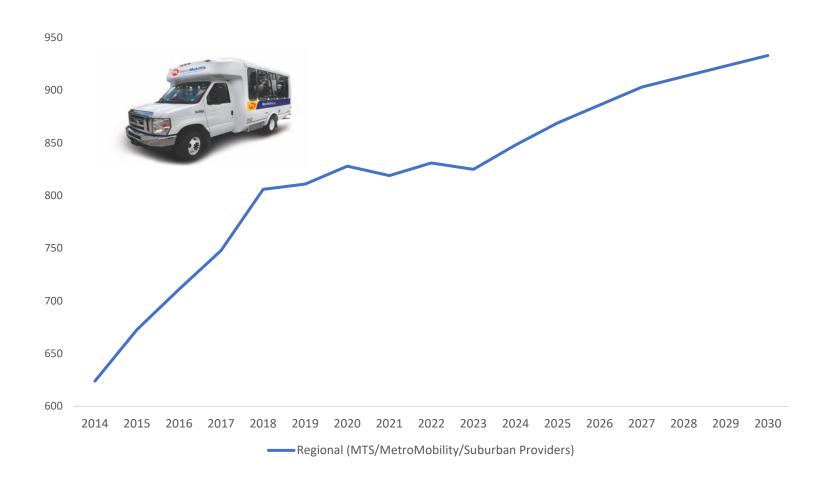

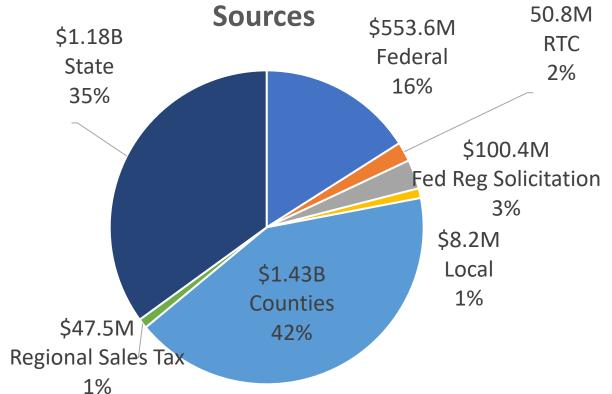
