- Investments in bus shelters, light, and heat continue to be equitably distributed.
- Achieve and maintain accessibility at bus stops with shelters.
- Increase availability of accessible bus stops through Metro Transit, roadway, and development construction projects.
- In support of safety and security, increase availability of lighting at shelters.




What's new for 2024


- Accelerate the capital plan






 100+ constructed or planned bus stop improvements



2023 Bus Stop Capital Improvements

Improvement	2023
✓ Added shelter	19
✓ Replaced aged shelter	25
✓ Accessible boarding area	82
✓ Added light, heat	4

These do not include 29 shelters with light and heat built for B Line are now open for bus riders on Selby Ave, Marshall Ave, and East Lake St in advance of B Line service.

Construction highlights

 Coordinated with roadway reconstruction to get more boarding pads installed
