# Dakota Land, Water, and People Acknowledgment

The Metropolitan Council acknowledges that the land we currently call Minnesota and specifically the seven-county region is the ancestral homeland of the Dakota Oyate who are present and active contributors to our thriving region. As part of the Metropolitan Council's commitment to address the unresolved legacy of genocide, dispossession, and settler colonialism and the fact that government institutions, including the Metropolitan Council, benefitted economically, politically, and institutionally after the forceable removal of the Dakota Oyate, the Metropolitan Council is dedicated to instilling Land, Water, and People Commitments in regional policy. These commitments support the Dakota Oyate, the eleven federally recognized Tribes in Minnesota, Ho-Chunk Nation, and the American Indian Communities representing over 150 diverse Tribal Nations that call the seven-county region home.

2. 2025-141: Transit Link Service for Dakota and Washington Counties, Contract 25P039 (Sheila Williams 651-602-1709)

It was moved by Osman, seconded by Carter, Toni, that the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute contract 25P039 with Transdev North America for Transit Link service in Dakota and Washington counties in an amount not to exceed \$34,518,700.

Council Members asked about the DBE goals and the amount of proposals received.

# Motion carried. Hearing no objection, Chair Barber stated the item could proceed consent to Council

3. 2025-142: Transit Link Service for Scott and Carver Counties, Contract 25l002 (Sheila Williams 651-602-1709)

It was moved by Carter, Toni, seconded by Chamblis, that the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute contract 25I002 with Scott County for Transit Link service in Scott and Carver counties in an amount not to exceed \$20,259,200.

4. 2025-86 SW: 2025 and 2027 Household Travel Surveys, Contract 24P006 (Brandon Whited 612-349-7561)

It was moved by Johnson, seconded by Carter, Tyronne, that the Metropolitan Council authorizes the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute contract 24P006 with Resource Systems Group (RSG), Inc. for consulting services for the 2025 and 2027 Household Travel Surveys in an amount not to exceed \$2,710,000.

Enterprise Inc that will continue to provide body worn cameras for officers in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000.
