Background

The Metropolitan Area Water Supply Advisory Committee (MAWSAC) is responsible for assisting Met Council in its water supply planning work. MAWSAC's work is supported by the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). With the adoption of Imagine 2050, the Met Council begins implementing the Metro Area Water Supply Plan (MWSP) and supporting local updates of comprehensive plans. Starting in 2025, MAWSAC and TAC have an important role in assisting Met Council by providing important guidance about local planning assistance for water supply planning. In early 2027, MAWSAC must report on regional water supply planning work to the Legislature and Met Council.

Roles and expectations

Committee chairs support committee goals and outcomes by guiding work plan development, leading meetings, and encouraging member participation.

Committee members

- Review materials. Council staff will strive to send materials a week in advance.
- Participate in the meetings. Based on experience and knowledge, share guidance and information with fellow members and Council staff to incorporate into draft reports, support letters to legislators or agencies, and/or project scoping. *Council staff will try to design meetings in ways to allow contribution in multiple ways for different communication/learning styles.*
- Advise on agenda topics related to emerging water supply issues, as appropriate

Council staff

- Provide MAWSAC and TAC support including drafting meeting materials, providing administrative support and facilitation during meetings, helping to implement relevant committee recommendations, and sharing information as requested.
- Coordinate with subregional engagement efforts to support alignment and relationship building.

2025-2026 Work Plan Goals

The MAWSAC-TAC work plan supports Met Council's long-range water supply planning function. In general, the decadal planning cycle focuses more heavily on certain activities in different phases, although all activities will take place in each year. MAWSAC and TAC work will shift to assist the Met Council on different efforts as this cycle goes forward.

MAWSAC has a larger role in work on regional policy and planning and in finding resources for regional implementation. TAC has a larger role to play supporting local plan implementation and evaluating impacts.

2025-2027 Meeting schedule and topics (Version 1 – for December 11, 2024 meeting)

Committee work is set by the committees, led by committee chairs. The work plan is framed by statutory requirements (M.S. 473.1565) and the updated Metro Area Water Supply Plan and informed by input from subregional work groups.

The proposed meeting schedule is based on committee member input in 2024. At that time, most preferred to meet on Wednesdays during the third week of the month, over the lunch hour and into early afternoon (12:00-3:00). One joint meeting of MAWSAC and TAC per year was preferred. This schedule will be re-evaluated periodically, such as when membership changes.

The timing and topics of committee meetings may shift as needed. Committee chairs may modify the work plan when approving detailed agendas.

Table 1 includes the proposed committee meeting schedule and high-level topics for 2025, 2026, and 2027.

2026 Meetings	Goal: At the end of 2026, the committees will have shaped technical assistance resources and finalized a report to the Met Council and the Legislature.
Wed, Feb. 19 TAC	TAC continues to provide input on technical studies that enhance technical resources for local and regional water supply planning. Input from subregional groups will be incorporated.
Wed, Mar. 19 MAWSAC	MAWSAC drafts the outline for a report to the Met Council and the Legislature, to support implementation and track progress of the MWSP. The report must be submitted by February 15, 2027.
Wed., May 21 TAC	TAC continues to provide input on technical studies that enhance technical resources for local and regional water supply planning.
Wed., Jun. 18 MAWSAC	MAWSAC drafts report to the Met Council and the Legislature, including MWSP progress tracking and recommendations around resource needs. A process to incorporate subregional input will be discussed.
Wed., Aug. 20 TAC	TAC reviews the draft MAWSAC report and continues to provide input on technical studies.
