2050 WATER RESOURCES POLICY PLAN UPDATE ADVISORY GROUP WORK PLAN, 2021-2025

Background

The purpose of the 2050 Water Resources Policy Plan Update Advisory Group (Advisory Group) is to advise and guide Council staff throughout the entire process of developing the new 2050 Water Resources Policy Plan. The Advisory Group advises MCES staff on the process to develop the 2050 Water Resources Policy Plan outreach activities as well as on the proposed content for the new plan.

This work plan, shaped by the Advisory Group Sponsors, Leaders, Members and Council Staff, will guide the Advisory Group's business and meeting agendas throughout 2021-2025. The timing of the topics or meeting dates may shift, especially given the uncertainties during the Covid-19 pandemic and recovery. Advisory Group Sponsors and Leaders may modify the work plan when approving agendas.

Goal

This work plan is designed to guide the Advisory Group's work as they assist and advise Council staff in the content development for the 2050 Water Resources Policy Plan from various perspectives within the water sector.

The meetings outlined in this work plan are intended to share information between policymakers and subject matter experts with the ultimate goal of developing informed, implementable policies that achieve multiple benefits for the region's communities and reduce unintended impacts to our water resources.

Roles and Expectations

Advisory Group Executive Sponsor (Sam Paske)

- Guide and support the Advisory Group Leaders & Council Staff
- Ensure the strategic alignment of the Advisory Group efforts with MCES and the Council's mission, vision, values.
- Provide approval authorizations as needed.

Advisory Group Leaders (Judy Sventek, Kyle Colvin)

- Facilitate discussion on policy goals/outcomes,
- Approve work plan and lead meetings to achieve outcomes.
- Encourage member participation.

Council Staff (Jen Kostrzewski, Shannon Skally, others as needed)

- Design, support, and facilitate meetings.
- Implement relevant Advisory Group recommendations and share information as requested.

- Send materials a week in advance.
- Design meetings in ways to allow contribution in multiple ways in order to accommodate different communication/learning styles.

Advisory Members

- Review materials that are sent out beforehand.
- Participate in the meeting share ideas, experience, and knowledge with intended audience.
- Share guidance and information with fellow members and Council staff. Guidance and direction will be incorporated into draft white papers, policy and implementation strategies and reports as appropriate.

Meeting Best Practices

Meeting Scheduling

- We will be using Doodle Polls to solicit the best dates for future meetings
- We will have 2-3 meeting planned per year, but the team is open to having more scheduled as needed (ad hoc for small work groups)
- We will alternate between in-person and virtual meetings based on weather forecasts, pandemic guidance from CDC, MDH, and the Metropolitan Council's protocols
