

2050 TPP OBJECTIVES - 8/14/2023

The 2040 Transportation Policy Plan presents the region's policies and plans to guide investment to develop the region's transportation system. These revisions reflect edits made to address feedback received during presentations and internal coordination meetings in July 2023. All objectives assume that transportation investments and their associated processes are the driving factors in impacting these objectives.

Clean Version

1. Our Region is Equitable and Inclusive

- a. Historically disadvantaged communities are better connected to jobs, education, and other opportunities.
- b. We repair and eliminate disparate and unjust impacts and harms to Black people, Indigenous people, and people of color.
