

Policies and Actions Development (1)

Proposed Approach

Phase I

- Evaluate existing 2040 • TPP for potential policies
- Group them by functional area (e.g., mode or impact)
- Start to delineate the difference between policies and actions

Phase II

- Incorporate 2050 goals and objectives, begin reorganizing around them
- Identify gaps, opportunities, and redundancy in policies and actions
- Review results of other inputs including scenario planning, stakeholder engagement, and planning studies




Opportunities for Streamlining

- Focus on the two primary roles of the \bullet **Transportation Policy Plan**
 - Guiding the orderly and economic development of the metro area (Comp Plans)
 - Guiding regional investments in or affecting the regional transportation system
- Make sure we say what is important and what are priorities first and clearly
- Identify actions by acting entity, providing more clarity on what is expected of regional transportation partners

Stewardship


Objective: By 2040 the transportation system will meet state of good repair targets.

Objective: Efficiently preserve and maintain the regional transportation system in a state of good repair.


Policy: System preservation is the top investment priority.

Action: RTPs will coordinate to maintain and operate shared facilities, including setting priorities for snow, ice, and debris removal. Strategy: Regional transportation partners
will place the highest priority for transportation investments on strategically preserving, maintaining, and operating the transportation system.

Strategy: Cooperate with MnDOT, regional transit providers, and regional parks implementing agencies in maintaining and operating shared and multimodal transportation facilities, including setting priorities for snow, ice, and debris removal.

Goal: Access to Destinations Objective: Increase the number and share of trips taken using transit, carpools, bicycling, and walking. Objective: Increase the number and share of trips taken using transit, carpools, bicycling, and walking.

Policy: RTPs will utilize the CMP process and TDM best practices to reduce SOVs before expansion is considered.


Action: Provide training and technical assistance to RTPs to implement CMP and TDM processes at the local level. Strategy: RTPs will promote multimodal travel options and alternatives...through a variety of travel demand management initiatives...

Strategy: Support, collaborate, and implement TDM policies, programs, and land use regulations...

Potential 2050 TPP Content

Existing 2040 TPP Content

Objective: Reduce fatal and serious injury crashes and improve safety and security for all modes of passenger travel and freight transport. Objective: Reduce fatal and serious injury crashes and improve safety and security for all modes of passenger travel and freight transport.

Policy: Every transportation project will incorporate proven safety measures.

Action: Annually update the high injury network and provide data to RTPs for local mitigation. Strategy: RTPs should monitor and routinely analyze safety and security data by mode, severity, and location to identify priorities and progress.

Strategy: Maintain, monitor, and routinely analyze local safety and security data to identify priorities for investment and coordinate this data with regional efforts.
