General Issues

Chapter would benefit from tweaks in formatting/chapter structure

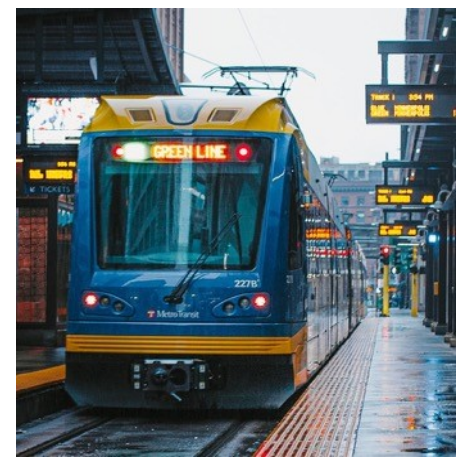
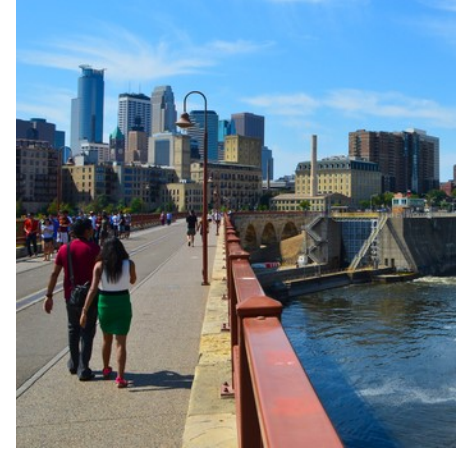
We will work on formatting the chapter to better show the hierarchy and provide greater clarity.

Chapter should be more consistent in the level of detail of the work program item descriptions

We will use feedback from the review to help determine where additional detail is needed.

Some work program items need to include explanation of the product(s) from the study

Where appropriate, we will be more specific with the outcome/product of the work program item.

Overall Themes

Clarify the role of Council and other agencies/stakeholders in work program items; partner where appropriate.

Some concerns about overlap with existing work, need to coordinate with other ongoing projects.

Language needs to specifically mention whether the work program item will directly affect the Regional Solicitation.

There is some need to further detail how work program items help fulfill the plan's goals, objectives, policies, and actions. Concerns and support expressed for some items, depending on interpretation of plan.

Studies need to account for new federal programs, goals, and funding opportunities.

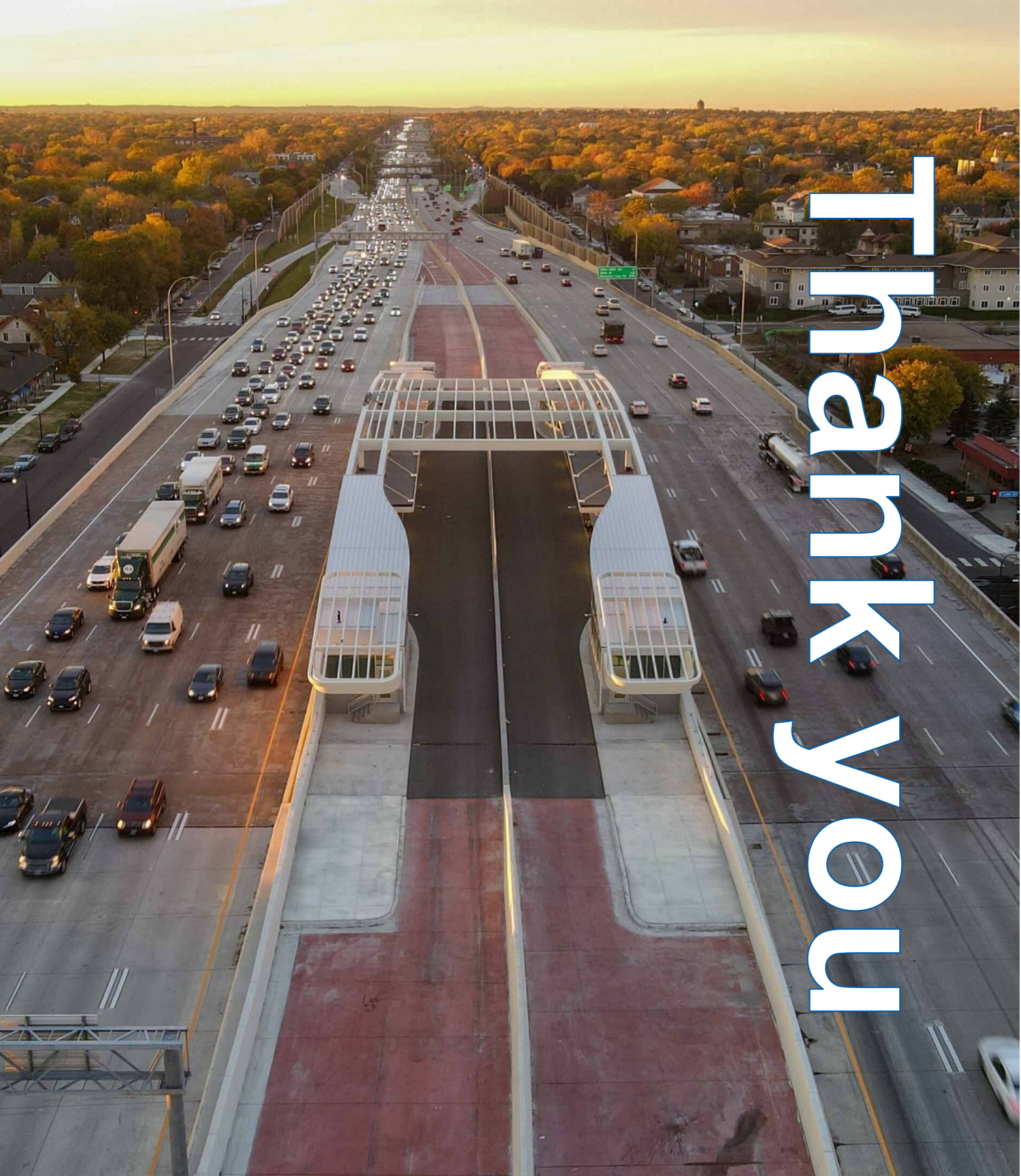
