## METROPOLITAN COUNCIL HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING MOVING TO WORK PLAN AND APPLICATION SUBMITTAL

The Metropolitan Council's Community Development Committee will conduct a public hearing to receive public comment on the submittal of an application for the Moving to Work (MTW) Program Expansion, Rent Reform.

The MTW program allows housing authorities to be more creative in addressing local housing needs. The program allows flexibility in how the Housing Choice Voucher program is operated. The goals of the MTW program are to:

- Expand housing choice for low-income families
- Create efficiencies in service delivery
- Assist families in making progress towards self-sufficiency

The Metropolitan Council Housing and Redevelopment Authority, Metro HRA, intends to submit an application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to test Rent Reform. Submitting an application does not guarantee the Metro HRA will be awarded MTW status. If awarded, the Metro HRA will conduct extensive engagement to develop a formal MTW Plan.
