Cultural Placekeeping

- Retain and strengthen the many cultures and histories along the Route
- Cultural placekeeping design groups will guide creation of architectural, aesthetic, and visual elements
- Metropolitan Council will identify areas where visual design input can be incorporated
- Each city has its own cultural placekeeping group who will co-create a design with Met Council design teams

- Staff as liaisons for communication between businesses and contractors
- Public Informational Sessions

Business support:

- Business advertising
- Provide wayfinding for customers




