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Overview

The 2023 Annual Regional Park & Ride System Report provides a summary of current trends in the Twin Cities regional Park & Ride system. A survey of the system was conducted in September and October 2023, which included a parked vehicle count with license plate data collection and bicycle count at all Park & Ride facilities.





Figure 1: Regional Park & Ride System Usage 1999-2023

Since early 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic has significantly affected travel demand, resulting in a major decline in transit ridership for commuter express service. Express service comprises a significant portion of transit service associated with Park & Ride facilities. Detailed information about routes and trips serving each Park & Ride can be found alongside corridor maps in Appendix B. At the time of the 2023 survey, express service remained suspended at some facilities. Facilities where bus service had been suspended at the time of the survey were excluded. 4 facilities were closed permanently since the 2022 survey. As a result, the survey included 68 Park & Ride facilities with a capacity of 27,402 parking spaces and excluded 21 facilities with an additional 4,617 parking spaces where service was suspended and Park & Ride use was not anticipated. Historic Park & Ride use can be seen in Figure 1.

In addition to Park & Ride facilities, there were 39 active Park & Pool facilities. Park & Pool facilities are designated parking areas that provide individuals a gathering point from which they can carpool to a common destination, whereas Park & Ride facilities are defined as parking facilities that are served by transit (i.e. they have bus or rail service). While both types of facilities are surveyed, this report focuses primarily on Park & Ride facilities.

Six transit providers operate the region's Park & Ride facilities and associated transit service: Minnesota Valley Transit Authority (MVTA), Maple Grove Transit, Metro Transit, Northstar Link, Plymouth Metrolink and SouthWest Transit. The region's Park & Pools are provided by the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) and Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT). The annual system survey is a collaborative effort conducted by the region's providers. Figure 2 shows the distribution of Park & Ride facilities by transit provider, including facilities with suspended service.

Figure 2: 2023 Regional Park & Ride System by Provider



The 2023 survey counted 4,024 regional Park & Ride users, a 9.1% increase from 3,687 users in 2022. This represents a 78.4% decrease from 18,653 users in 2019. The system utilization rate in 2023 was 14.6%. Park & Ride system usage continues to increase since travel patterns changed due to COVID-19 in 2020, but recovery from the pandemic has slowed compared to the increases seen in 2021 and 2022. Capacity and usage changes by service provider may be found in Table 1. The use comparison rates reflect 2023 use with 2022 and 2019 as baseline years. Along with a reduction in use and capacity, the number of daily trips and routes serving Park & Rides is also lower in 2023 than in 2019.

In 2023, Park & Pool had an observed 441 vehicles across 839 facilities in Minnesota and Wisconsin for a utilization rate of 19.5%. Compared to the previous year's survey, Park & Pool usage has remained relatively stable.

Capacity Changes

There was a net decrease of 567 parking spaces at Park & Rides in 2022 [see Table 3]. In the past year, 6 facilities - totaling over 800 spaces - have closed. Two new facilities in Plymouth opened in 2023, adding capacity to the system.

Park & Pool facilities had a net decrease of 24 spaces [see Table 5]. These changes were simply due to recounts to reflect the capacity more accurately at these facilities.

About the System Survey

The system has been surveyed annually since 1999 in collaboration with staff from state, county, and regional agencies to collect data for vehicles at each Park & Ride and Park & Pool facility. Data collection dates are held on a Tuesday-Thursday in late September and early October to target typical school and work use outside of holidays. For 2023, the data was collected at each Park & Ride facility with active transit service. Counts were conducted between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. between Sept. 26 - 28; Oct. 3 - 5. In the past, system-wide license plate surveys have been conducted biennially on even-numbered years as part of the system survey process. License plates were not collected for the 2020 survey but were collected in 2021 and 2022. License plates were collected again this year to support the Network Now project.

License Plate User Home Origin Data

Metro Transit obtains Minnesota user origin data from the Driver and Vehicle Services (DVS) Division of the Minnesota Department of Public Safety. Geocoding user origin data makes it possible to show generalized customer origins while protecting individual user privacy. Maps of customer origins provide information about user travel patterns and allows transit providers to plan accordingly. This data also provides insights for transitway ridership forecasting. Park & Ride users' home origins from Minnesota license plates and counts by geographic area are shown in Figure 3 and Tables 6 and 7.

Several municipalities throughout the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area have reached an agreement with the Council to implement the Transit Capital Levy. Consequently, all taxable properties are assessed for transit and paratransit capital within these communities. These areas are collectively known as the Transit Capital Levy Communities (TCLC). The data from this year's survey show that 77 percent of users reside within the TCLC and 23 percent of users come from outside the TCLC to use Park & Ride facilities.

The proportions within the TCLC and by county reflect a similar distribution to the 2018 and 2022 survey, despite changes in overall use.



Capacity Usage

Busiest Park & Ride Facilities

There are 23 facilities with more than 50 vehicles, 12 of which also had more than 100 vehicles. These facilities are listed in Table 8. For comparison, in 2019, 63 facilities had more than 50 vehicles and 45 had more than 100.

Facilities with over 100 cars represent 42% of capacity and 62% of usage in 2023 and facilities with over 50 cars represent 82% of capacity and 76% of usage. In 2019, the facilities with over 100 cars represented 79% of system capacity and 89% of 2019 usage.


Least Busy Park & Ride Facilities


Figure 4: Park & Rides with More Than 50 or Fewer Than 5 Vehicles



Capacity Utilization by Facility Type

Capacity utilization has increased across all facility types since 2022. There were small increases in utilization at commuter, light rail, and bus facilities. BRT facilities saw a significant increase in capacity utilization from 23% in 2022 to 33% in 2023 [Figure 5].

System Capacity and Usage by Travel Corridor




Figure 6. Regional Park & Ride System Utilization by Corridor

Most corridors saw increased usage over 2022. By count, the I-94 West, Hwy. 77 South, and I-35W South Lower corridors have the greatest total use and the greatest capacity. The I-35W South Upper corridor saw the highest use percentage. Figure 6 and Table 10 provide use by corridor. See Appendix B for corridor maps and usage of the facilities within each corridor, including user origin points.


Planned Capacity Expansion

Planned Park & Ride expansion projects are typically in coordination with new transitways. There are new Park & Ride facilities planned along the Green Line LRT Extension, Blue Line LRT Extension, and Gold Line BRT. Currently, these planned new Park & Rides are estimated to add a capacity of 3,814 to the system. Table 11 shows the planned capacity along each of these transitways. These totals are subject to change. Figure 7 shows the system's Park & Rides with existing and planned transitways and planned Park & Ride locations.










V. **I-35W South Lower Corridor**
















