

Chanhassen Interceptor Rehabilitation Project in Chanhassen

Final Project Update: August 31, 2021

Issue 11

Metropolitan Council Environmental Services made improvements to aging and deteriorating regional sanitary sewer facilities that serve homes in Chanhassen and neighboring communities. Rehabilitation was necessary to avoid collapse that could result in a loss of sewer service, environmental impacts, public health and safety risks. The Chanhassen Interceptor Rehabilitation Project includes sewer pipe and structures repaired between January 2020 and August 2021. Restoration will continue through September 2021.

Project area

The project was divided into two sites:

- Site 1: The Park —a redevelopment site— from Galpin Boulevard to Majestic Way.
- Site 2: Along Lake Lucy Road near Highover Drive.

The project used cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) technology which injected an inverted liner into the existing pipe structure. Sewer maintenance holes were repaired or replaced as needed.

Project Completion

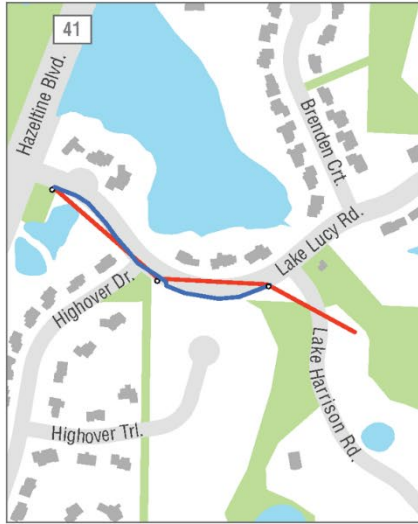
All sewer work was completed at both sites. The following items were completed as part of the project:

1. CIPP was installed to rehabilitate sewer pipes at Sites 1 and 2
2. Maintenance holes were rehabilitated with inserts
3. Final seeding, tree planting, and erosion control blankets were installed at both sites

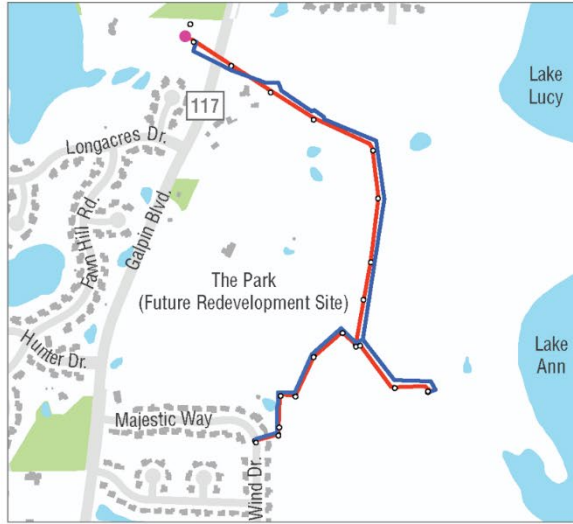
