

MEI Rehabilitation

Otis Avenue and Pelham Boulevard

Metropolitan Council Environmental Services (MCES), operator of the metro area wastewater collection and treatment system, will be rehabilitating their Minneapolis East Interceptor (MEI) system at six sites in the cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul.

Otis Avenue traffic changes begin the week of June 6

Rehabilitation on the MEI system at Otis Avenue and Pelham Boulevard will begin the week of June 6 and is estimated to be completed in Fall 2022. Rehabilitation in this area includes:

- Odor control improvements.
- Rehabilitation of sanitary sewer structures.
- Clean up and restoration of any disturbed areas.

What to expect during construction



The bike lane on Pelham Boulevard will be closed from Otis Avenue to approximately 400 feet north of the intersection. Bicyclists will share the northbound traffic lane on Pelham Boulevard around the work zone.



Temporary stop signs will be installed on Pelham Boulevard at the Desnoyer Avenue intersection for both north and southbound traffic.



Temporary crosswalks will be installed at the intersections of Otis and Desnoyer Avenues. Crosswalks will be installed to cross Desnoyer Avenue at the intersection of Pelham Boulevard, and on the north side of both intersections at Otis Avenue and Desnoyer Avenues to cross Pelham Boulevard.
