



HELP SHAPE THE FUTURE OF VACTOR WASTE DISPOSAL

Metropolitan Council Environmental Services (MCES) would like to better understand your current vactor waste disposal practices and future needs. We will use this information to improve our understanding of customer cities' and townships' needs for vactor waste disposal facilities and determine next steps for addressing this topic.

Sanitary sewer vactor waste is defined by MCES as solids removed from sanitary sewer facilities, most often during cleaning operations. Materials in vactor waste typically include: grit, sludge, debris, fats or grease, and rags (such as wipes, textiles and diapers).

Sanitary sewer vactor waste does not include waste generated by storm sewer cleaning.

Sanitary sewer vactor waste does not include liquid wastes such as septage from portable toilets.



The survey is short and includes questions on:

- When and how you perform sanitary sewer cleaning
- Where you dispose of your vactor waste
- Features you'd like to see in a regional vactor waste disposal facility
- Survey results will be made available on the MCES customer portal
