







2018 Minnesota Water Values Statewide Resident Survey (n=1,498, BIPOC=44) Urban Waters survey respondent primary residence










#### Survey Respondent Gender Identity



## Racial and Ethnic Identity Extremely Important Water Values to Protect (%)



Davenport 2019

- 73% are very or extremely concerned about climate change
- 87% believe climate change impacts to water is a moderate to severe problem

On average are significantly <u>more concerned</u> than White respondents about

- Water damage to homes
- Water supply

On average report being <u>less familiar</u> about water issues in their community and <u>place higher importance on learning more</u> than White respondents

## A Community-Centered Framework of the Value of Water in the Twin Cities

- How do residents perceive and value water? How do narratives vary across communities?
- What are opportunities for enhanced public visualization, communication and engagement around water?
- How do we identify and prioritize community-centered action steps for equitable water planning and policy?

- Survey Twin Cities residents in select communities
- Conduct geospatial data visualization for communication
- 3. Conduct virtual interviews/focus groups with community leaders and staff
- 4. Analyze and report on findings including regional comparisons and action steps
