



Integrity and commitment

- 13 years lost
- 1,000-foot journey
- 1 month to find owner
- · 2 months of media
- 650+ dedicated Environmental Services (ES) employees and Regional Administration partners



Ring found at Rogers Wastewater Treatment Plant



March

- Ring found by Todd Bennett, Bruce Jensen, and John Tierney while performing maintenance.
- They ask, "What can we do to find the ring's owner?"
- Posted to social media.
- Media relations staff arranged Minnesota Public Radio interview.
- 50+ calls into ES General Inquiries telephone line

Search for the rightful owner

April

- Media event at Metropolitan Plant
- Massive public response
 - 350+ email inquiries
 - 400+ calls
- ES Communications Team responded to each call and email.
 - As far away as eastern Canada
 - As long ago as 30 years
 - As unlikely as Target store floors, open fields, and airplane connections at Minneapolis-Saint Paul International Airport

"There are only three things you should flush, and a diamond ring isn't one of them."



Confirming the rightful owner



April

- A Rogers resident reached out. Information indicated a potential match.
 - Right sewershed, right ring materials and design
- Two separate jewelers affirmed probable match.
 - Compared ring to photos from the resident

May

- Rogers resident reunited with her ring after 13 years.
- Own a sewer cleaning company.

"What did you guys do to my ring? That's my ring."

May


- Media event at Rogers Plant announced reunion of the ring and its owner.
