Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to award and execute master contracts 21P339 A-C for water resources planning, design, and consultation services with not to exceed amounts as follows:

Background

Water Resources master contracts which provide technical services in the areas of sustainable landscapes, stormwater management, and water resources are needed to support the Capital Program.

The Request for Proposals was issued on September 15, 2022. A pre-proposal meeting was hosted by Council staff that outlined solicitation requirements, discussed project specifications and responded to plan holder inquiries. There were twenty-three registered plan holders, nineteen consultants, two subcontractors, two plan rooms, and five of the plan holders identified as minority, woman, small, veteran, or disadvantaged business enterprises. On November 27, 2022, the Council received seven proposals to be evaluated for consideration of award.

In accordance with the Brooks Act, the evaluation of proposals followed a two-step process. An evaluation panel of Council staff ranked and selected the most technically qualified proposers. Following approval of the evaluation panel findings, conclusions and recommendations, the cost data of the top three proposers was reviewed by a negotiation panel that negotiated pricing and agreed that the final prices have been determined to be fair and reasonable and recommend Barr Engineering, HDR Engineering, and Stantec Consulting as the most advantageous to the Council.

Rationale

The execution of professional service contracts exceeding \$500,000 require Council approval.

Thrive Lens Analysis

This action advances the Thrive Outcomes of Stewardship and Sustainability. Public financial resources will be responsibly invested to support orderly economic development while maintaining the regional wastewater system assets, which protect the region's natural resources.

Funding

Funding is provided in the authorized capital program.

Small Business Inclusion
