

## SEWER CLEANING WASTE DISPOSAL FACILITIES

Site location, descriptions and use conditions for Sewer Cleaning Waste Haulers

## Site Location

The Metropolitan Council provides disposal sites for the discharge of sanitary sewer cleaning wastes within the grounds of its Metropolitan Water Resource Recovery Facility (WRRF) located in St Paul. Only those holding a Met Council Sewer Cleaning Waste Hauler Permit are allowed entrance into the Metro WRRF to dispose of approved sewer cleaning waste loads.



## **Site Descriptions**

Two disposal sites are provided for the discharge of sewer cleaning waste. One site is for liquid wastes, and the other site is for solid wastes.

Wet Vactor disposal site – The Wet Vactor site is for discharging liquid sewer cleaning wastes
that are primarily organic in nature and containing a substantial amount of liquid with some solid
materials present.



2. Dry Vactor disposal site – The Dry Vactor site is for disposing of primarily solid wastes (i.e. heavy grit mixed with domestic wastes) with only minor amounts of free liquid present.



## **Site Use Conditions**

- The Wet and Dry Vactor disposal sites at the Metro Plant are open on weekdays from 6:00AM-6:00PM. Additional hours are available upon request by calling Metro Security in advance.
- A valid driver's license is required for anyone entering the plant, and no one under 18 years old is allowed inside the plant.
- Drivers entering the Metro Plant must sign in at the security building at the entrance to the plant and complete a Vactor load receipt.
- Drivers must sign out at security when leaving the plant premises.
- Drivers must use only the designated routes to the disposal sites.
- Drivers are restricted from access to any of the buildings on plant grounds. If drivers are found anywhere but on the designated routes, Met Council may deny further access to the disposal sites. There are no public restrooms available at the sites.
- All waste must be discharged and/or disposed of using a Vactor type truck. Dump trucks and 55-gallon drums are prohibited.
- The disposal sites must be kept clean, and drivers must take appropriate measures to prevent spillage during discharge and use water provided at the sites to wash down miscellaneous spillage.
- Security cameras are located at each site, and drivers will be held accountable for any spillages left. Drivers must immediately notify security staff if a spill occurs.
- Drivers must comply with all disposal site access requirements, general permit conditions, and site-specific security measures, including direction provided by on-site security and plant staff.
- Drivers must also comply with all traffic rules (speed limits, traffic direction, queuing, etc.)
   specific to the respective sites.
