



Light Rail Transit Fact Sheet

How much does it cost to ride?

Fares for LRT are the same as local bus fare – currently \$2.25 during rush hour and \$1.75 at all other times. Fares are valid for 2.5 hours from the time of purchase. One fare allows you to transfer between LRT lines and from LRT to bus. The fine for riding a train without paying is \$180.

How do I pay to ride?

Purchase a ticket at a ticket machine on the station platform or validate your Go-To Card at the card reader on the platform before you board the train.



What features are at each station?

Each platform has a ticket machine, card validator, benches and leaning posts, a kiosk with general information, and electronic signs that indicate the time of the next train. There are also canopies and shelters for protection from typical Minnesota weather and heaters in the shelters that can be turned on in the winter time.



Safety is a top priority of Metro Transit. Each station also includes security cameras and emergency phones. Warning devices alert pedestrian to approach train and signs instruct people to look both ways before crossing tracks.

What hours and how frequently does LRT run?

On weekday, the Blue Line currently operates 22 hours a day from 4:00AM to 2:00 AM, with 10-minute frequency from 6:00 AM to 7:00 PM.

Evening and weekend frequencies vary from 10 to 25 minutes, during the day and 30 to 60 minutes at night.
