### **Consent Business**

Consent Business Adopted (Items 2025-39)

1. 2025-39:Solid and Industrial Waste for Environmental Services Facilities, Contract 24P149 (John Young, 651-602-8281) proposes that the Metropolitan Council authorize the Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute contract 24P149 with Waste Management of Minnesota, LLC to provide solid waste services for the Council in an amount not to exceed \$4,772,250.

1. **2025-25**: **Metropolitan WWTP Polymer Procurement, Contract 24P127** (Joe Ward, 651-602-8302)

It was moved by CM Wulff, seconded by CM Morales, that the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to award and execute contract 24P127 with Polydyne, Inc., to provide polymer to the Metropolitan Wastewater Treatment Plant in an amount not to exceed \$24,025,000.

 2025-3 JT: Advance the 2050 Water Policy Plan for Council Final Adoption (Jennifer Kostrzewski, 651-602-1078)

It was moved by CM Wulff, seconded by CM Osman, that the Environment Committee recommends to the Metropolitan Council to accept the public comment report for the 2050 Water Policy Plan and adopt the 2050 Water Policy Plan and the 2050 Metro Area Water Supply Plan as a component of the Imagine 2050.
