### Information

1. Local Planning Stories: Planning for Climate Change

Eric Wojchik, Planning Analyst, Community Development, introduced Rachel Workin, City of Fridley, and Emma Struss, City of Bloomington. Workin and Struss were invited to share the stories of their cities' work on climate change initiatives.

Rachel Workin began with an overview of the work in Fridley. Fridley has a strong park focus and is a Mississippi River community. Emma Struss then shared an overview of Bloomington's work on sustainability and reaching climate goals. Wojchik then facilitated a discussion with both presenters, with questions regarding the challenges that cities face, data supporting the work, and the next big initiative for each city.

Council members had questions and comments regarding data, rebates, energy efficiency and home values, tree removal cost, and the role of data, incentives, and equity within sustainability work. They also discussed the cities' role in working with small businesses, best practices for transit- oriented development, and outreach and engagement.
