Approval of the Consent Agenda (Items 1-10)

- 1. 2018-131 Authorize its Regional Administrator to negotiate and execute Engineering Services Master Contracts 17P047A and 17P047B for the design and construction support of interceptor sewer improvements projects to CNA Consulting Engineers in the amount of \$1,000,000 and to Brierley Associates in the amount of \$500,000.
